Upcoming Schedule for February – Lent begins Ash Wednesday, February 22nd

Ash Wednesday, February 22nd at 7 p.m. will begin at Cross of Glory for the season - a traditional service that will include imposition of ashes and communion.

Mid-week services begin again the following week, with the evening schedules as follows -

- 3/1 @ West Meal at 6 p.m., Service at 7 p.m.
- 3/8 @ Cross Communion Instruction begins 5:30 6:15 p.m., Meal at 6 p.m., Service at 7 p.m.
- 3/15 @ West Meal at 6 p.m., Service at 7 p.m.
- 3/22 @ Cross Communion Instruction 5:30 6:15 p.m., Meal at 6 p.m., Service at 7 p.m.
- 3/29 @ West Last Midweek Wednesday worship Last Communion Instruction 5:30 6:15 p.m., Meal at 6 p.m., Service at 7 p.m.

The makeup of these services will be using the Holden Evening Prayer (with additional vocalists, thanks to Judy, Karen and Cindi!), and our worship/sermon series will feature dramatic interviews with key Bible characters who surrounded Jesus leading to the cross. Confirmation Students will be required to attend these services, and reading, drama and maybe even song leadership will include them as well (though maybe not exclusively)

Holy Week services will be as follows - Maundy Thursday 4/6 with 6 p.m. service at Cross, 7:30 p.m. service at West; Good Friday service at 7 p.m. at West (as near as we can distinguish, last year 2021 was at Cross); Easter Sunrise 7 a.m. @ Cross with breakfast to follow, and at 9 a.m. @ West with rolls etc. prior to worship.

I'm certain there will be other details regarding service on Ash Wednesday as well as for Holy Week services, but those will come. This is a GREAT start for now, with a strategy for communication space in both the February and the March Newsletter, and the big finale (Holy Week/Easter) will highlight April there as well.

Again, HUGE thanks to you all! I'm so glad that you are all serving where you are, and have taken such interest in worship planning at both churches...this is truly a breath of fresh air for this newbie pastor! Looking forward to walking this season to come with you all!

A word about our Lenten Worship Series from Pastor Marcia – You've seen and heard the schedule and plans that are in the works around this spring's season of Lent, and we're excited to experience Lenten worship with you all. A unique opportunity to hear some of Jesus stories in a different voice, in a casual and approachable way comes along with this...as owe embark together into the Lenten Dramatic Series entitled "Sparks Around the Fire: Compassion and the Cross", a five-act dramatic sketch that introduces some real campfire discussion surrounding some of the primary and even contentious stories that Jesus told during his life and ministry.

Written by David R. Weiss, "Sparks..." is actually a work of fiction, with big truth nuggets throughout. Based on his studies and understanding, these short dramas are Weiss' take embodied in four recurring weekly characters who talk about their own human reactions to the stories of Jesus including The Prodigal Son, The Good Samaritan, The Sheep and the Goats, Loving your Enemies and the Ten Maidens. Each scripture reading will be followed as our characters invite us as a congregation to the campfire conversation as they react to these stories, much in the same way that we might if we were among the crowds hearing these teachings.

For Weiss, he has been "convinced that compassion was at the very heart of Jesus message...and that it was his proclamation and practice of [radical] compassion that led to the cross." So together with these biblical texts, we take a different reflective view by bringing these texts together, along with some imaginative license, to think in a different way about biblical truth in these narratives.

His hope in writing these dramas was that "you find these fictional conversations, set up as "sparks around the fire" as those that lead you into deeper conversation yourselves: with the texts, with one another, and with your own lives."

These dramas, paired with the beloved Holden Evening Prayer as our worship setting, should serve to create a different space and feel for this season. Come...join us as we sit fireside for this season of Lent.

Minutes of Cross of Glory Annual Meeting-December 11, 2022

President Jerry Morstad called the meeting to order and asked for an adoption of the agenda. No objection was voiced and the agenda was adopted as listed. Linda Lynne made a motion to accept the agenda and Martin Johnson seconded the motion. Jerry led us in devotions as Bridge Pastor Marcia Pedersen was leading service at West Freeborn. Carol Light read the secretary's report from the 2021 annual meeting, which was submitted by Jill Morstad, Deacon. There were no additions or corrections to the secretary's report. Hearing none, Jerry stated the report was approved as read.

Treasurer Linda Brekke gave the treasurer's report referring to the balance sheet as well as the Profit and Loss and Budget vs. Actual documents. As of November 30, 2022 the total liabilities and equity was \$162,651.94. The proposed budget for 2023 was then reviewed. It was pointed out that Pastor Marcia will receive a reimbursement for health insurance of \$3000.00 since her coverage is under her husband's policy. This is a significant savings for our congregation. Thanks was given to Jerry and Jill for working on the budget and for all their leadership during the past year. They were also presented with a gift of appreciation.

Earl Lynne made a motion to accept the treasurer's report and the proposed budget as listed and seconded by Ron Bartness. Motion carried. Jerry read the president's report as was printed in the annual report.

Old Business: Jerry expressed thanks to Chris Lynne for helping with the weather stripping and door maintenance and Corky Modene and son-in-law for working on front steps of parsonage. Some members of the council are in the beginning stages of planning our 1^{st} annual Scandinavian Advent Celebration to be held in December of 2023.
