Honoring Christ on Memorial Day

This coming Memorial Day, <u>thousands of churches will pay tribute to our country's fallen heroes</u>, recognizing the liberties and freedoms we enjoy, and remembering the brave men and women who have given their lives for our country. Memorial Day is focused upon those who have fallen in the service of our country, but at the same time it is an opportunity to focus on Christ.

Those who have given their life for our country have experienced the tragic bloodshed that conflict brings. Our world is rocked by strife and division. But one day there will be peace. The author of that peace is Jesus himself, who is described in Scripture as the Prince of peace. Jesus gave his life to gain spiritual victory over sin, death, and hell. Memorial Day gives us a chance to praise our Lord for the price he paid, and the triumph he secured.

President Jerry Morstad called the meeting to order and Pastor Marcia led us in prayer. Carol read the minutes of the March 7, 2023 meeting. Paul made the motion to accept the Secretary's report and Jill seconded it. Motion carried. Linda gave the Treasurer's report. Martin made the motion to approve Treasurer's report as read and pay bills as funds allow. Ron seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Marcia presented a detailed report to the council for the month of March. If you would like to see the report, there will be one in the office to view. Some items being scheduled are the following: Power and Boundaries Workshop-Thursday, April 27, Suicide Prevention Skills Workshop for Rural Communities-April 27, May 4, 11 & 18 and Synod Assembly May 6. Angela Bell and Pastor Marcia met regarding vision and planning for our church. It was decided to wait until fall to begin this process.

Parsonage Update: Steve will check with Hartland-Manchester Telephone Company to find out if there is a shared line between the parsonage and church. Matt Johnson, realtor and Duane Spooner will meet on Thursday, April 13. **Old Business:** There was positive feedback regarding Holy Week services and Easter Breakfast. Jerry and Jill attended the Councils as Leaders Event. Some of the topics that were discussed from their trainings included: rewriting constitutions, running effective council meetings, social statements, and ELCA Faith and Society.

New Business: Confirmation students and Wednesday Church School will do yard cleanup during their last session of the year. Paul will bring a trailer for the debris. Lenten mission monies will be matched for the New Richland Area Food Shelf. To date \$489.73 has been collected with two more weeks of monies to be added to this total. There will be a communion serving sign-up sheet being circulated, so this responsibility doesn't rely on a few

individuals, but a community of members. It was decided by the council that there will not be communion at the April 23 service. Communion will be offered at Pastor Pedersen's Ordination Service. There is an open invitation to participate in the ordination choir. Rehearsal will be at 1:00 pm on April 23. Installation is scheduled for April 30. A meal will be served at West Freeborn following their service of installation. Confirmation will not be over Memorial Day weekend/Pentecost Sunday. Pastor Marcia will be in contact with families that are involved. A thank you was received from the ELCA Good Gifts program regarding our donation to this program at Christmas. **Financial Support:** Thanks to everyone for your fiscal support of Cross of Glory. Special Congregational Meeting: Parsonage Sale - April 2, 2023

President Jerry Morstad called the meeting to order and opened the floor up for discussion. Deacon Jill Morstad shared the following pros and cons for selling the parsonage. This information was compiled from information obtained with discussions from Rev. Barb Streed, Assistant to the Bishop from the SE MN Synod of the ELCA, Rev. Matt Larson, SE MN Synod of the ELCA staff member working with call candidate, and Bridge Pastor Marcia Pedersen.

Pros: Keep:

-Pastor would be near the church and live in the community.

-No housing allowance paid if pastor lives in the parsonage.

-Traditional and part of our roots.

-Emotional ties.

Sell:

-Any candidate for call has a housing option, which matches their personal needs.

-May invest proceeds from sale.

-There would be no maintenance and upkeep expense.

Rent:

-Additional income

-Retain ownership for present and future options

Cons:

-Additional maintenance and upkeep costs

-Housing allowance needed for pastor (30% of base salary)

-Currently this is a cost of \$6500.00 for each congregation

-Renting would create landlord responsibilities and risks

Trends:

-25% of congregations in the call process have parsonages available

-Pastoral duties are a 2nd career for most of call candidates at the present time

-Candidates may already have their own home or may want to build equity in their own home

We would need a parsonage committee if we decide to rent or sell the parsonage. Zach Jacobson brought up the idea to rent until the market resumes to a better level. Vote was taken with 40 voting members. Votes to sell the property totaled 37, and votes to keep the parsonage was 3. The votes were tallied by Arlene Thofson, Donn Riskedahl and Carol Light. After the votes were tallied Ann Lynne made a motion to sell the property and Ron Bartness seconded the motion. Motion was carried by the congregation.
