#### Sundays and Mentors and ALL IN...Oh My! Fall and Faith Formation at Cross and West

A HUGE thank you goes out to Jade O'Byrne (West Freeborn) and Lacey Koopal (Cross of Glory) for your visioning, your organization and your readiness as we dig into Fall 2023 for Children, Youth and Families in our congregations! You know your families, your kiddos in both churches, and we are blessed by your enthusiasm and presence as fall children's programming unfolds.

**Sundays at West** – Look for some barely-noticeable tweaks, especially parents, as we plan to intentionally engage and **connect a many of our children's sermons to our Sunday School lessons** as possible. As we work to be more intentional in our overlap, remember parents and families that talking about our faith lessons often and outside of Sunday mornings helps them to stick for life-long faith development! (And you're doing a GREAT job!)

**Wednesdays at Cross** – you'll see a return of our monthly Pizza Nights, always coupled with a standing request for lemonade or beverages, sides that are healthy like GoGurt, Fruit Cups or fresh fruit, Veggies and dip, or even sweet treats for desserts. **Mentors and Mentor Nights** for 3<sup>rd</sup> year Confirmation Students are new this year, so as we roll out our 3<sup>rd</sup> Year Confirmation expectations, you'll see these pop up about every other month. 3<sup>rd</sup> Year students **should be looking for a mentor** (preferably a congregation member from your congregation or our parish partner) who can be present with and for you as you go throughout the year. <u>Remember to notify Pastor Marcia once you've chosen your mentor!</u> **Our First Mentor Night of the year will be Wednesday, October 25<sup>th</sup>, so as you work through some of your mentor packet** together, share a pizza supper and get to know each other, we look forward to supporting you through the year to come. Tentatively, our 3<sup>rd</sup> year students are looking toward Confirmation Sunday on April 21<sup>st</sup>, 2024.

All In Nights- As we look to make space for the entire community, we're adding once a month Wednesdays ALL IN Nights, where our confirmation students through seniors in high school are welcome for an evening of fun, games, food/snacks and connecting faith lessons. One question posed to me already was "Is this also a Confirmation class night?" and my answer was YES. Though we'll step away from our curriculum in our Bible Overview year, we will be working on our community and team building skills as we welcome those confirmed already and our incoming students new to classes this year. We're excited to see how these changes help us connect to each other, to our Faith in God, and to our wider church community.

**It's a Wrap! -** Thanks again to all who have participated in reading and discussion around our two summer reads, focused on books written by Indigenous/Native American authors around the #truthandreconciliation studies and emphasis in the churchwide ELCA. **Present**: Pastor Marcia Pedersen, Steve Bakken, Ron Bartness, Linda Brekke, Carol Light, Paul Lynne and Jerry Morstad. President Jerry Morstad called the meeting to order and Pastor Marcia led us in a prayer. Carol read the minutes of the August 8, 2023 meeting submitted by Jill Morstad. Ron made the motion to accept the Secretary's report and Matt seconded it. Motion carried. Linda gave the Treasurer's report. Matt made the motion to approve Treasurer's report as read and pay bills as funds allow. Steve seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor Marcia presented a detailed report to the council for the month of August. If you would like to see the report, there will be one in the office to view. Pastor Marcia gave a recap of the August events and services in her report.

**Old Business:** Pastor Marcia and Cindi researched four possibilities for a computer to replace the one in the office. The selection was narrowed down to the Dell Inspiron 3020 Intel package and the Dell Inspiron 27 inch Touchscreen. After a group discussion, Paul made a motion to purchase the Dell Inspiron 3020 Intel package for \$1049.98 plus the service plan. Steve seconded the motion. Motion carried. The cost of the computer will be shared with West Freeborn. Steve will continue to be in touch with Brandon Flatness regarding the church basement walls.

**New Business:** Repair or replacement of bathroom sinks is scheduled for Friday, September 8. Forms need to be signed this evening to move forward with this project. The broken basement windows have been replaced where glass was broken.

Pastor Marcia will be meeting with Kari Thostenson on September 6 regarding the use of the church facility for MSP/LIS for Rural Communities. This is a program that helps coordinate people with needs with resources in their community. Pastor Marcia invited any one from the council that is interested to attend this meeting.

Confirmation for Cross of Glory will be held on Sunday, October 8 at 10:30 am. A lasagna dinner will be served. A free will offering instead of tickets will be included. Kathy Spooner will work with the Confirmation students and leaders to make their own stoles for Confirmation. We will be purchasing gowns for Confirmation Sunday and will add to this selection each year as needed.

A form of communication is needed to gather information from members of the congregation as to what to do with money from the sale of the parsonage. Do we want a letter or a survey format? Should this be mailed or emailed or both? It was stated in the July minutes that we would like this feedback by November 15, so it would be ready to discuss at the annual meeting.

Paul made a motion to cut curb to the south and place an apron to the height of sidewalk. Also, repair curb on the north side of church with the apron to the height of the sidewalk. Ron seconded the motion. Motion carried. This will help with removal of snow.

Thank you for your financial support of Cross of Glory. It is much appreciated. Matt made a motion for adjournment and seconded by Ron. Motion carried. Meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

For our Bible study this month, let's look at the scripture readings for October 15, 2023. If you find this interesting I hope that you will join others to go deeper. In Isaiah we are given a vision of the great feast to come, when God will wipe away

death forever.

Read Isaiah 25:1-9.

After a hymn of praise acknowledging God as a shelter for the poor, the prophet portrays a wonderful victory banquet at which death was swallowed up forever. The prophet urges celebration of this victory of salvation.

Though writing from prison and facing an uncertain future, Paul calls on the Philippians to rejoice and give thanks to God no matter what the circumstance.

Read Philippians 4:1-9.

God's peace is with us and binds together our hearts and minds in Jesus Christ, especially when things around us do not seem peaceful. Do we feel bound together in today's world?

In Jesus' parable about a great banquet, those invited do not come, so the invitation is extended to others. In our liturgy God spreads a table before us.

Read Matthew 22:1-14

Jesus tells a parable indication that the blessings of God' kingdom are available to all, but the invitation is not to be taken lightly.

Even amid anxiety and hardship we rejoice in the peace of God which surpasses all understanding. With great joy we feast at the table of the Lord, and we go forth to share the wonderful invitation with others hungering and thirsting for the abundant life of God.
