

What Is Lent All About, and Why Is It Important?

Have you ever wondered what people are talking about when they say they're giving something up for Lent? Do you want to understand what Lent is and how it relates to Easter?

Lent is the 40 days (not including Sundays) from Ash Wednesday to the Saturday before Easter. Lent is often described as a time of preparation and an opportunity to go deeper with God. This means that it's a time for personal reflection that prepares people's hearts and minds for Good Friday and Easter.

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent. You may have noticed people with a smudged, black cross on their foreheads. Those are ashes from the Ash Wednesday service. The ashes symbolize our grief for the things we've done wrong and the resulting division of imperfect people from a perfect God.

Maundy Thursday is the day before Good Friday. It commemorates the night before Jesus died, when He shared the Passover meal with His closest friends and followers.

Good Friday is the day Christians remember Jesus' death. The "Good" reflects how Jesus' death was a sacrifice on our behalf so we can receive God's forgiveness for our wrongs, or sins.

Easter Vigil is the night of salvation! At the Vigil of Easter, we gather around fire, word, water, bread, and wine, proclaiming through story and song that ours is a God who continuously brings life out of death. On this night we experience again the heart of God's baptismal promise and the center of our faith; we are claimed and cleansed, renewed in the death and resurrection of Christ. We gather with all the saints of every time and place to celebrate the good news: Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Easter Sunday is the joyful celebration of Jesus rising from the dead to give us the opportunity of eternal life. While people still die, Jesus made the way for people to have a relationship with God in this life and to spend eternity with Him in heaven.

The three main things people focus on during Lent are prayer, *fasting* (abstaining from something to reduce distractions and focus more on God) and giving, or charity.

<u>Prayer</u> during Lent focuses on our need for God's forgiveness. It's also about repenting (turning away from our sins) and receiving God's mercy and love.

<u>Fasting</u>, or giving something up, is a very common practice during Lent. The idea is that giving up something that's a regular part of life, like eating dessert or scrolling through Facebook, can be a reminder of Jesus' sacrifice. That time can also be replaced with more time connecting with God.

Giving money or doing something good for others is a way to respond to <u>God's grace</u>, generosity and love. For example, some people spend time volunteering or donate money they would normally use to buy something, like their morning coffee.

It's important to note that doing these things can never make us earn or deserve Jesus' sacrifice or a relationship with God. People are flawed and will never be good enough for a perfect God. Only Jesus has the power to rescue us from ourselves. Jesus sacrificed Himself on Good Friday to bear the punishment for all our wrongdoings and offer us forgiveness. He was raised from the dead on Easter Sunday to give us an opportunity to have a relationship with God for eternity. Spending time during Lent praying, fasting and giving can make Jesus' sacrifice on Good Friday and His resurrection on Easter even more meaningful.

Greetings in the name of God our Creator, Christ our Redeemer and the Holy Spirit our Sustainer...Amen!

Today is a day I never thought would come...the day AFTER votes held to call me as your pastor. Though that isn't a reality for any of us, I'm thrilled to envision a future together in mission for the Gospel of Christ with you all! Thanks be to God for this call and your faithfulness in the process!

A special thank you to Call Committee members including Emily Wakefield, Angela Bell, Ronnie Bartness, Jade O'Byrne, Becky Ausen, and Sue Bakken, Council Presidents Jerry Morstad and Glenn Ausen for your hard work and faithful leading during this Bridge Contract time period; to the congregational councils at both Cross and West; and to you, the congregation members who showed your presence on Sunday, February 26th to vote to call me as your Pastor. It has been an honor getting to know you as this Bridge Contracted time comes to an end and a time of Called Ministry begins with you all! Though the sky may be dreary, my heart is full as I look forward to our future together!

Thanks be to God for the people of Cross of Glory and West Freeborn, and to the journey ahead of us as Christ's Church...together!

Lord God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Do-it-Yourself Bible Study

For our Bible Study this month, let's look at the scripture readings for March 12th.

If you find this intriguing I hope that you will join others to go deeper.

In today's gospel the Samaritan woman asks Jesus for water, an image of our thirst for God. Jesus offers living water, a sign of God's grace flowing from the waters of baptism.

Read Exodus 17:1-7. Because the thirsty Israelites quarreled with Moses and put God to the test, Moses cried out in desperation to God. God commanded Moses to strike the rock to provide water for the people. The doubt-filled question – "Is the Lord among us or not?" How would you react in this situation?

Though we often hear that God helps those who help themselves, here Paul tells us that through Jesus' death, God helps utterly helpless sinners.

Read Romans 5:1-11.

Since we who had been enemies are reconciled to God in the cross, we now live in hope for our final salvation. In today's world, do we feel this hope?

The early church used this gospel to deepen baptismal reflection during the final days of preparation before baptism at Easter. As we journey to the resurrection feast, Christ comes among us in word, bath, and meal – offering us the life-giving water of God's mercy and forgiveness.

Read John 4:5-42.

Jesus defies convention to engage a Samaritan woman in conversation. Her testimony, in turn, leads many other to faith.

Are we willing to talk to those people that are different from us?

President Jerry Morstad called the meeting to order and Pastor Marcia led us in devotion and prayer. Carol read the minutes of the January 10, 2023 meeting. Report was approved as read with the following correction to the minutes: Jim and Dude's Plumbing and Heating fixed the toilets and urinals, not Jerry. Ron made the motion to accept the Secretary's report and Steve seconded it. Motion carried. Linda gave the Treasurer's report. Paul made the motion to approve Treasurer's report as read and pay bills as allowed. Jill seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Marcia presented a detailed report to the council. Information regarding worship, pastoral care, Christian education, meetings and questions to be explored further are addressed in the report for the month of January. Old Business: The ELCA Good Gifts donations to date is \$840.11. It was decided to go ahead and present the gift of money towards the "farm" through the Good Gifts program. A Valentine's Brunch will be held on February 11 instead of a "Souper" Luncheon. The Cross of Glory Altar Guild will be hosting this event. Jill and Jerry have repaired the kitchen counters. The handbook updates were reviewed and modified as needed. A motion to accept updated handbook schedule of charges was made by Steve and seconded by Paul. Motion passed.

New Business: The call committee had its first meeting and recommended the hiring of Pastor Marcia Pedersen as our permanent pastor. The council did a roll call vote to accept this recommendation. The vote passed unanimously by council members present. The congregational vote will be held on February 26, 2023 following the service. Cross of Glory will host the Ash Wednesday service on February 22, 2023. The council and Wednesday Worship/Confirmation families will host the meals on March 8th and March 22nd. The ELCA SE MN Synod has asked us to increase our financial contribution. Jill made a motion to move \$1000.00 from the Mission Fund to the General Fund checking to go towards the ELCA SE MN Synod support. Ron seconded this motion. Motion passed. The new member by transfer policy was discussed. We are expecting some new members as we move forward. An insurance meeting is scheduled for February 9 with our agent. Jerry and Ron will attend this meeting. Emily made a motion to designate our Lenten offering to the N.R. Area Food Shelf. Linda seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Financial Support: Thanks to everyone for your fiscal support of Cross of Glory. It is much appreciated. Ron made a motion for adjournment, seconded by Jill. Motion carried. Meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
