Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. (Romans 8:26)

In frightening and confusing times like these we will probably find ourselves wanting to turn to God in prayer. It could be that you have encountered posts on the internet that advise you to pray for this, that or the other thing. All of which can be helpful, and I am sure that it is. But if you are like me it can leave you feeling as if you sent your prayer off to God, but was that really the best prayer, or did I ask for the right thing.

Your "Amen" may be followed by a feeling that something seems to have been left unsaid. A prayer can feel incomplete or insufficient under the circumstances. There are always specific people or issues that we feel confident to bring before the throne of the Almighty, but in the face of a viral epidemic and calls to avoid being around other people, and the uneasiness that such thoughts raise within us, it becomes difficult to know how we ought to be responding.

Which is why I wanted to bring the Apostle Paul's words from Romans before you this month. Not knowing what is appropriate or best to pray for is something God understands about us. If our prayers can strengthen our faith and trust, and lead us to acknowledging that we continue to be cradled in the arms of one who cares deeply about each one of us, perhaps the Holy Spirit is working within us and offering prayers we cannot voice.

Growing up in Minneapolis as I did, not far from downtown, we lived in the same house my mother grew up in. She would tell me about what life was like in that neighborhood during the Second World War. One of the things she recalled was the fact that people were encouraged to plant "Victory Gardens". Lawns were dug up and vegetables planted in front yards.

As a kid I remember thinking that it seemed like a dumb response to a war being fought overseas, but now I think it had more to do with the fact that it gave people a way to get involved and come together. We are being asked to do the same. We will get through this - together.

Joint Council meeting - Tuesday, April 7, 2020 at West Freeborn

Joint Council Meeting—Cross of Glory & West Freeborn - January 7th, 2020

Cross of Glory's president, Jerry Morstad, called the meeting to order. Present were: Jerry Morstad, Pat Ehrich, Becky Ausen, Rachel Knudson, Mike Ehrich, Martin Johnson, Matt Hoelscher, Jill Morstad, Steve Bakken, Glenn Ausen, Paul Lynne, Tim Bartness, Ron Bartness, Dave Ausen, Linda Brekke, Steve Ausen, Emily Wakefield, and Pastor Steve.

Pastor Steve led us in prayer. He also gave his pastor's report. He included his parish register updates. His pastoral activities report included leading worship service at Whispering Oaks in Ellendale with Judy Wyrum. Also, he reported on enjoying the Christmas programs put on by the kids in our congregations, thanking the people who worked hard to put the programs together and those who decorated the sanctuaries for the season. West Freeborn hosted the Blue Earth River Conference monthly gathering on Jan. 2. He also mentioned he's already looking ahead toward the Lenten season and making plans for services, which will include the kids again this year.

The secretary's report from the last Joint Council meeting was read by Becky Ausen. The only correction was to adjust the attendance to include a few people who arrived a few minutes late. The minutes were otherwise approved.

Open Issues:

- 1. West Freeborn's annual meeting will be held Sunday, January 19th. They stated they do not need to switch worship times, as they will have their service at 9am, followed by an early lunch and annual meeting.
- 2. There was a note from Cindi regarding the copier. We are currently using one donated to us from the Freeborn Historical group. It has been put to a lot of good use but we need to start looking at a possible replacement for the future. She had information on a lease-to-own contract. Martin suggested that we look at buying an all-in-one laser printer. The question was raised whether we want to have a color or just black and white. He volunteered to go look at prices. It was also suggested that if we can always go to a commercial printer for big projects.
- 3. Pastor Steve went on Medicare after his birthday. Nancy was added on to insurance through Portico. There was conversation about the cost of the health premiums. Pastor Steve stated he will call to see if there is a price difference with Nancy being retired. Glenn made a motion to table the discussion for a month until we get more information. Martin seconded.
- 4. A reminder for those who help with Communion during service, we should be prepared to offer blessings to the children who come forward.
- 5. There was a suggestion to revisit the intent of the Healing Worship Service and advertise it ahead of time to make the most out of the opportunity. (We have been holding it whenever a month has a fifth Sunday.)

Steve Ausen made a motion to adjourn this half of the meeting to allow the councils to reconvene for our respective council meetings. Tim Bartness seconded.

Old Business:

We need to replace the sidewalk that was torn up when we did the plumbing work. We could coordinate with a time that the cement truck will be coming to town. The picture window also needs to be repainted. The east steps is a project that still needs to be finished.

New Business:

- 1. We discussed the money we collect at the Lenten offerings and suppers and Paul made a motion to use it to pay for the new copier that we bought. Tim seconded. Ron Bartness made a motion to designate the Easter offering to the New Richland Area Food Shelf. Paul seconded.
- 2. We thought that we might have a church clean-up day the same day as we work on the parsonage.
- 3. Next Wednesday, the other half of the council will be serving at the Lenten supper. We also talked about what to have Easter morning after sunrise service. Last year we did rolls or muffins, juice, and coffee and that seemed to go well. We don't have to have a large meal with egg bakes because everyone will be going home and having a big meal, plus we no longer have the numbers of youth to sponsor the breakfast.
- 4. Matt's mowers were beyond fixing at the end of the mowing season last fall so he won't be taking on that job again this year. Alvin had mentioned he would be interested in lawn mowing. Jerry will check with him.
- 5. Paint on the metal awning over the front doors is chipping off and should be touched up as we get projects completed leading up to the centennial celebration.

Paul Lynne made a motion to adjourn the meeting and Tim Bartness seconded. Closed with the Lord's Prayer.


Urgent Announcement from Lutheran World Relief
