Bible Study for June - A glimpse into Matthew's Gospel

Week of June 4th – Today is Holy Trinity Sunday, also the 1st Sunday in Pentecost, the longest church season...much is marked with green paraments, and symbols of growing as for us in the northern hemisphere, we are in our major growing season. Today's Gospel is found in Matthew 28:16 – 20, and is commonly known as the Great Commission. As you read this, think about what the word "commission" means (maybe even a dictionary with multiple meanings).

How does our title of this change when we call this the Great Co-Mission instead? How could we respond differently to this meaning?

As you think on this text this week, I offer this prayer...

God of heaven and earth, before the foundation of the universe and the beginning of time you are the Triune God, author of creation, eternal Word of salvation, life-giving Spirit of wisdom. Guide us to all truth by your Spirit, that we may proclaim all that Christ has revealed and rejoice in the glory he shares with us. Glory and praise to you, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen.

Week of June 11th – Today begins our Time after Pentecost, the 2nd Sunday of Pentecost (there are over 30 Sundays in this church season). The Gospel for the day goes back into Matthew to begin accounts of the life and ministry of Jesus, today's is found in Matthew 9:9-13, and 18 – 26, an account of the calling of Matthew to accompany and learn from Jesus, and to partner in ministry together. Interestingly, Matthew is "called" from a tax collection station, a place known to be fraught with deception, unjust and overly taxing folks, and often taking the surplus for their own selves...which caused quite a stir for those who were already scrutinizing the actions and presence of Jesus...to which Jesus says that he has "not come to call the righteous but sinners."

The second part of this text is an account of the healing of a woman who touched only Jesus garment, while a leader in the community who comes for the purpose of asking to restore to life his daughter who has just died...both the girl and the woman are healed, yet it is the women who doesn't ask for anything, only hope...to which Jesus responds by saying that "your faith has made you well."

What are some things that you wonder about in this text? - Who has a voice and speaks? Who doesn't have a voice? - How does this connect when we consider those we are called to help, or support, or accompany?

A prayer... O God, you are the source of all life and the ground of our being. By the power of your Spirit, bring healing to this wounded world, and raise us to the new life of your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Amen.

Week of June 18th – On this 3rd Sunday of Pentecost, we read the Gospel text of Matthew 9:35 -10:8, and if you're ambitious, also 10:9-23. In these verses, Jesus followers get an early sense that at some point they will be expected to do the work of Jesus, to continue the mission to which he is training them for. He calls the 12 Apostles, then casts his mission and purpose...and in the additional verses, he paints a picture of mission and ministry that won't all be happy, sparkly...but Matthew outlines what to do when you're welcomed into a place, and also what to do when you aren't. Jesus equates their mission as being sent as sheep out to do ministry among the wolves...and there are times when the wolves may actually look like sheep in disguise.

We can imagine what this may have looked like in Jesus time, but what does this look like in ours? If we've experienced wolves disguised as sheep, how have we responded? And how does this leave us feeling?

Who are those who help YOU to feel restored when the unexpected happens? How can you let them know how much you appreciate their presence this week?

A prayer for the week...

God of compassion, you have opened the way for us and brought us to yourself. Pour your love into our hearts, that, overflowing with joy, we may freely share the blessings of your realm and faithfully proclaim the good news of your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Amen.

Week of June 25th – 4th Sunday after Pentecost, with our Gospel a continuation of Matthew 10:24-29...which is a connection to the Gospel from last Sunday. This specifically warns of the challenges that the Apostles will encounter. Yet he also affirms that they shouldn't fear, for the truth will be illuminated and that true living is found in Christ.

Some big scripture nuggets to chew on -v. 34 says "Do not think that I have come to bring peace to the earth' I have not come to bring peace but a sword...." When we call Jesus the Prince of Peace, yet he says things like this, what do you think he means?

And another...v. 39 says "Those who find their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it." What does this make us think of? Have there been things in life that you've "found" or "lost" that connects with this verse?

How do scriptures like this help us to find peace in a world that seeks to divide? Is peace possible? How?

A prayer for the week...

Teach us, good Lord God, to serve you as you deserve, to give and not to count the cost, to fight and not to heed the wounds, to toil and not to see for rest, to labor and not to ask for reward, except that of knowing that we do your will, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Amen.

Present: Pastor Marcia Pedersen, Steve Bakken, Linda Brekke, Matt Hoelscher, Martin Johnson, Carol Light, Jerry Morstad, and Jill Morstad. President Jerry Morstad called the meeting to order and Pastor Marcia led us in a blessing, "Waking up to life again". Carol read the minutes of the April 11, 2023 meeting. Martin made the motion to accept the Secretary's report and Jill seconded it. Motion carried. Linda gave the Treasurer's report. Matt made the motion to approve Treasurer's report as read and pay bills as funds allow. Steve seconded the motion. Motion carried. All but \$9.00 of the money collected for the area food shelf was matched. The total given to the NRAFS was \$1,227.73. This was our designated offering for the Lenten and Easter season. Martin made a motion to add \$500.00 to the office account. Matt seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Marcia presented a detailed report to the council for the month of April. If you would like to see the report, there will be one in the office to view. The Synod Power and Boundaries Workshop is required by clergy to attend every three years and the Suicide Prevention Skills Workshop for Rural Communities was well received. The Synod Assembly will be held on Saturday, May 6 and the Mayo Clinic Health System Event Center in Mankato, MN.

Parsonage Update: Following is a list of completed projects and yet to be completed projects.

-Walk through by realtor Matt Johnson, Deb Allen and Duane Spooner; -Wiring upgrade in basement; -

-yard vacuumed/sticks removed/cleared out under bushes/and some bushes removed; -low spots filled with dirt; -floors swept and dusted; -basement walls and floors painted; -scraped, patched, painted 2nd floor bathroom ceiling and caulked above shower and cleaned shower; - replaced toilet and sink faucet; -replaced kitchen sink faucet and caulked behind sink; -scraped, painted and caulked outside picture window (eastside) and caulked inside; -windows are washed except a few outside of 2nd story; -light fixtures cleaned; -refrigerator, oven, kitchen cupboards cleaned; -bathroom vanities cleaned; -cleaned and organized garage; -Glen Ausen purchased the snow blower.

To Be Completed: - cracked basement windows are being repaired and replaced; - steps on east side of parsonage; -rain gutters

Old Business: Pastor Marcia has a sign-up sheet in the narthex for volunteers to sign-up for serving communion. Pastor Marcia gave us a recap and a thank you for all the support given to her during the preparation and events of her ordination. New Business: A Memorial Day Service is being planned by the American Legion. Veteran Service Officer from Freeborn County will be the guest speaker. The Cross of Glory Altar Guild will be serving lunch and the NRHEG School Band will play. Confirmation will be held this fall with a possible transition to move towards spring confirmation with future classes. Some time was spent brainstorming ideas for summer services: outdoor worship, single service with West Freeborn with a potluck to follow, a campfire night, outdoor games, movie night with pizza and popcorn and Bible School options. One item was discussed and decided on, which was to offer a sign-up sheet for serving coffee/beverage for the first and fourth Sundays of the month. Remember we will be switching service times to 10:30 am beginning on June 4. This will be our new service time for the next year.
