We Worship Our Savior During Holy Week 2014

Palm Sunday, April 13: This service begins with the story of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. The story takes a turn, however, as we listen to the subsequent events of Jesus' arrest and crucifixion. The Sunday School children will sing for worship and carry palm branches at our morning services, 9:00 a.m. at West Freeborn, and 10:30 a.m. at Cross of Glory.

<u>Maundy Thursday, April 17:</u> Hear the story of Jesus' final evening with his disciples. Jesus began the meal we call the Lord's Supper. Services of Holy Communion will be held at both churches this evening: 6:30 p.m. at Cross of Glory, and 8:00 p.m. at West Freeborn

<u>Good Friday, April 18:</u> One joint worship service for both of our congregations will be hosted at the Cross of Glory church at 7:00 p.m. This "Service of Shadows" is a solemn service of hymns and readings centered in the story of Jesus' crucifixion. This is an appropriate story for Christians to hear, and an important time to worship.

Rejoicing in the Cemetery

There is a story in the eleventh chapter of John about a trip to the cemetery that turned out to be a celebration of life.

Jesus goes to the tomb of a dear friend, Lazarus, who

has died. There is much crying in that lonely place. Even Jesus cries for his good friend. If ever there was any doubt about the compassion Jesus felt for Lazarus and his family, his visit to the cemetery erases it. And if ever there was any doubt about God's power over death, the raising of Lazarus that day changed the family's doubt into faith.

I have had people tell me about how difficult trips to a grave side can be. It's not so much going there that's tough - it's leaving. Turning around and leaving the grave of a loved one can be a wrenching experience of the beginning of separation.

It's the hope in the resurrection, the knowledge that we will one day be reunited, that enables us to make that journey back from the cemetery, back to our homes, back to our lives. In this sense, faith can make that journey just as much a celebration as it was for Lazarus and his family.

In some Christian congregations they have a tradition of beginning their Easter morning celebration in the cemetery near the church building. They testify that the trip from the grave to the light of the church sanctuary is a powerful reminder that faith moves from sorrow and hurt to a celebration of eternal life in Jesus Christ.

Whatever feelings you may have about a trip to the cemetery, the story of the raising of Lazarus assures us that Jesus has made that trip himself. He made it with friends who, along with himself, knew the reality of grief and tears.

Not only that – Jesus made the trip to the cemetery as one who would experience death himself. And his walk out of the tomb on Easter morning began the ultimate kind of rejoicing in the cemetery!

3. There is a programmable thermostat that Bohlen will install. We won't need to install a taller toilet in the women's bathroom because one of the toilets is already the taller height.



Introduction to Our Synod Assembly Bible Study Leader Posted on March 19, 2014 by S.E. MN Synod

The Southeastern Minnesota Synod Assembly for 2014 is right around the corner. The event will be held at the Mayo Civic Center on May 2-3, 2014. Hopefully there are clergy and lay voting members from your congregation who are planning to attend!

The theme of Synod Assembly this year is "We are Called: A Glocal Mission Event." Engaging worship, insightful workshops, and uplifting music will be cornerstones of the experience this year.

Our Bible study leader will be Rev. Rafael Malpica-Padilla. He serves as Executive Director for the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America Division for Global Mission. Rev. Malpica-Padilla is a faithful, long-time leader in the Lutheran Church. He leads from a commitment to being a denomination that is both thoroughly global and intensely local. For Rev. Malpica-Padilla, following Jesus is central to all we say and do.



In a 2013 sermon in at the South Dakota Synod Assembly, he preached: "We are an inclusive and open community of followers of Jesus, serving a world in need. We, the church of Jesus Christ, are God's instruments for the transformation and renewal of individuals, communities, and the whole creation. Through our witness, people will come to know who this Jesus is, and to follow in his steps." As a way to get to know Rev. Malpica-Padilla, he gracious shared a few thoughts on ministry and our global community.

Rev. Malpica-Padilla, what are a few aspects of ministry that bring you the most joy as a pastor? The opportunity to touch people's lives and be touched by their experiences. Luther called this the "mutual consolation of the saints," which I believe should be the third sacrament in our church if there were to be another one. This is the vision for mission emanating from the Lutheran Confessions, that in the midst of our brokenness, God reaches out to us and restores community with us (justification), and through the Holy Spirit calls and gifts us to restore community with one another (sanctification), to bear each other burdens, and to be "little Christs" to one another. Seeing what God does through us, globally and locally is a great joy.

If a congregational member in rural Minnesota wants to start engaging with ministries happening in other parts of the world, where do you recommend they get started?

In their local community. He or she must ask, what are the opportunities for mission and service in this place where God has called her or him to be? The most important missiological question today is how do we engage the other, and conversely, how are we engaged by the other? A prominent theologian has said that we, the church, are becoming who we are, "One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic." The ELCA, as a member of the global Lutheran communion knows that the reason we engage the peoples of the world, as well as communities of different racial, ethnic, economic backgrounds is that without them we are not whole. We engage the other in the same manner that God in Jesus engaged us. In the Global Mission Unit we call that movement accompaniment.

We look forward to his Bible study leadership in May. Thanks be to God for the ministry of the ELCA Division for Global Mission.
