The Heart of a Father

As a father cares for his children, so does the Lord care for those who fear him. Psalm 103:13

Mr. Sutherland lived in the city of London during World War II. His only remaining family was his son, Wilfred, a flier in the Royal Air Force. One day he received news that his son's plane had been shot down over Holland. It was not known whether he bailed out and survived or whether he went down in the wreckage and died. Mr.

Sutherland carried the hope in his heart that somehow Wilfred survived.

On Easter morning in 1948, Mr. Sutherland thought he saw the familiar face of his son in a crowd of people at a train station. But before he could reach him, he was lost again in the crowd. The father reasoned his son was alive, and he was suffering from some kind of amnesia. So he withdrew all his savings from the bank, made up posters with his son's picture on them, and gave his own address and telephone number, hoping that his son would see one, remember who he was, and return home. Then every Easter Mr. Sutherland stood at the railway station, looking again for his son's familiar face.

When Jesus described the kingdom of God, he told just such a story — a story of a father waiting for his prodigal son, waiting to see the familiar face of the one he loves. Understand the heart of this father, Jesus says, and you will understand God's heart in relationship to you. You can read that story in the fifteenth chapter of the Gospel of Luke.

Fathers never give up on their lost children, and God never gives up the search for us. He is right now looking for his children, even more diligently than they are looking for him. As we remember whose we are, and turn in his direction, we will find that he has been chasing after us all along.

A special meeting of the West Freeborn Church Council was held on May 01, 2014 at 7 p.m. Present were: Pat Ehrich, Mike Ehrich, Steve Ausen, Dave Ausen, Nancy Pederson, Holly Dahl, Milo Madson, Dale Christopherson, Bob Indrelie, Mark Broskoff, Orlen Modene and Becky Ausen.

Orlen stated that this meeting was being held because Cross of Glory would like West Freeborn to sign off on giving Cross of Glory the right to give the City of Hartland the street that runs in front of Cross of Glory. After discussion by the council, Dale made a motion to give Orlen the right to sign off and give Cross of Glory the right to give the City of Hartland the street in front of the church. Dave seconded it. Motion passed.

It was then brought up that the roof over the bathroom needs to be redone. It needs to have a little slope to it. It should be able to be done for \$5,000 or less. Holly made a motion to accept Rightway Roofing's bid with an addendum that a \$5,000 cap be put on the project. Mark seconded it. Motion carried.

Pat Ehrich will have the monthly financials at the meeting in June. Mike made a motion to adjourn. Steve seconded it. Motion carried. Closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Cross of Glory Trustees Meeting – April 1st, 2014

President Glenn Ausen called the meeting to order. Lyle Bird and Tim Siewert were absent.

Pastor Frank led the council in devotions and prayer.

The secretary's report was read by Rachel Knudson. Steve Bakken made a motion to approve the minutes. Paul Lynne seconded.

Jon Stelter read the treasurer's report. Paul Lynne made a motion to pay the bills as money allows. Tim Bartness seconded.

Old Business:

- 1. April 8th at 7pm has been selected as the night to fix the coat rack.
- 2. Bohlen came and worked on the faucets and furnace but did not install the thermostat.
- 3. Paul Lynne purchased a notebook computer, a projector, virus protection for one year, HDMI cable, and Microsoft Office. Thanks to him for doing the work to get this project done.
- 4. The door closures have been finished. They recommended changing the weatherstripping around the doors because, as it is now, it gets caught and stresses the door closures. Matt Hoelscher made a motion to do all the doors that need to be fixed. Randy Light seconded.
- 5. Now that the weather is turning nicer, it is time to address the concrete around the bell tower. It was suggested to talk with John Hullopeter.

New Business:

- 1. It was brought to our attention that the replacement faucets didn't include the kitchen sink downstairs. After discussion concerning the fact that this faucet doesn't currently leak and is typically used once a year (at the soup & pie supper) we will not upgrade it at this time.
- 2. However, there are problems with the Altar Guild faucet and drain, the water fountain, and the toilets in the upstairs and downstairs bathrooms. Steve made a motion to call a plumber about the issues and update what necessary in order for these problems to be alleviated. Tim Bartness seconded.
- 3. Lifetouch has been in contact, as this summer we will be taking photos again for a pictorial directory. It has been five years since the last community directory. There will be a meeting on Tuesday, May 20th at 2pm to have people learn how to figure out a schedule for families to sign up for photo slots. Rachel Knudson and Tim Bartness volunteered to attend.

- 4. The memorials from Wes Crowe's funeral will be used to replace the pew Bibles. We are waiting to purchase them until we find the right copy (proper font size, binding color, and version). We plan to get samples so people can look at them and choose the right one.
- 5. The deacons will be ordering the Easter lilies from HyVee.
- 6. There has been a great response for the Baskets of Promise for Lutheran World Relief this Lenten season.
- 7. Confirmation Sunday will be April 27th. Confirmands this year are Kallie Jo Spooner and Josh Fleming. Dinner is open to all and will cost \$6 per person. Tickets will be sold starting this week. Questioning the confirmands will be done by the trustees and deacons on April 13th at 9:15am in the social hall.
- 8. The newsletter went out on email this last time without any glitches. Steve Bakken made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Paul Lynne seconded. Closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Cross of Glory Trustees Meeting – April 22nd, 2014

The May meeting of the church council was held a couple weeks early to coincide with the meeting of the Cross of Glory section of the cemetery committee (consisting of Randy Light, Virgil Thofson, and Steve Bakken) to address some business. President Glenn Ausen called the meeting to order. Lyle Bird, Tim Bartness, and Tim Siewert were absent. Virgil Thofson was present.

Before we conducted any other business, we addressed the topic of the cemetery. Corley Hendrickson has offered to let the combined cemetery of Cross of Glory and Hartland Evangelical Lutheran Churches purchase three acres of land to increase the size of the cemetery. After much discussion and exploring various view points, the council and the cemetery board decided to not be in favor of the land purchase. Some of the reasons against buying the land include the fact that we currently have adequate space in the cemetery with no foreseeable space restrictions. When we calculated the rate at which people are purchasing lots per year, the fact that congregation sizes continue in a downward *Continued...*

rate, and that many current congregation members have already purchased lots and erected stones, we realized the demand for our current space needs do not exceed our present land holdings. The tax issue would also be complicated if the land was purchased by tax-exempt churches but remained in farming production. Further, many years in the future, if we have need to expand the cemetery, the then-current owner may be willing to donate the land for the tax benefits.

This business concluded, Virgil departed and we continued with the rest of the regular meeting.

Pastor Frank led the council in devotions and prayer.

The secretary's report was read by Rachel Knudson. Matt Hoelscher made a motion to approve the minutes. Steve Bakken seconded.

Jon Stelter read the treasurer's report. Memorials from Orvin Morstad are to be used to repair the door closures. Depending upon the amount, any remaining money will go to the air conditioning fund. We need to increase the amount of money specified in the bulletins to better reflect the actual amount needed each month to cover the bills. Paul Lynne made a motion to pay the bills as money allows. Randy Light seconded.

Old Business:

- 1. The coat rack has been fixed and there were only 16 hanger rings that needed replacing.
- 2. Glenn signed the street easement so now the street in front of the church belongs to the city.
- 3. John Hullopeter stopped to look at the base of the bell tower. He thinks that it will be straightforward to add two to three inches of concrete to the base. He will submit a quote. Jon Stelter made a motion to go ahead with the project if the estimate is reasonable. Paul Lynne seconded.
- 4. The weatherstripping seals have been replaced and one of the doors has been trimmed so it closes more easily.
- 5. Bohlen was here and worked on the toilets, water fountain, altar guild sink, etc. Everything seems to be working well.
- 6. We received a bid on the air conditioning system. For five exterior units, it will be about \$16,000.

Contilue When the city blacktops the streets, it would be the best opportunity to repave the street behind the church. With the city already booking a large job, the cost per square foot would be lower than if we had someone out to work exclusively on our small street. We will get a bid that includes the bulk price.

New Business:

- 1. The deacons met and have begun working on plans for Vacation Bible School. This year is Cross of Glory's turn to host. There are three options for the schedules and the planners are trying to figure which has the best advantages and which the parents want more. Look forward to further notifications!
- 2. The weather is finally starting to come around so Matt and the boys will have lawn care coming up.
- 3. Confirmation Sunday is this coming Sunday. Kallie Jo Spooner and Josh Fleming will be confirmed.

Matt Hoelscher made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Steve Bakken seconded. Closed with the Lord's Prayer.
