# Our Story and God's Story

The Lord...brought us into this place. Deuteronomy 26:9

Each of us has a story about where we came from and how we got to be who we are. Some of those

stories extend back to the days of immigrants who came looking for land and found it. Even if your story doesn't go back that far, still it is a story embroidered with memories of school, learning to do chores, growing up to be big enough to work with livestock and large machines. Who you are and what you count as important was shaped at least in some small part by the fact that you grew up on this land rather than some place else.

When do you reflect on that story? For farm families, things "start" in the spring. Machines get repaired, seed purchased. When you begin the growing season, do you review your own story? Do you sometimes take five paces back and look at what it's all about?

Moses in the Book of Deuteronomy reminded the people of Israel that they were to reflect on their story regularly. Not a shallow "walk down memory lane" or a shower of nostalgia. Rather, a deep and faithful review of how they got where they were. How God had given them the land. How God had provided for their needs. They were to remember the covenant relationship God had made with them, and to look for its renewal each year in the planting and the harvest.

That's why we take time today to reflect on both *our story* and *God's story*. With today's technology, it's too easy to take the wonders of the seed, rain, and soil, and reduce them to terms of schedules and commodities. It's pretty easy to lose sight of God's hand in it all. But we must take time to remember.

Reflect on your own story, and on God's story, too. See and hear God renewing his creation through yet another spring and another planting. Then remember all the other plantings in your lifetime, and eagerly look to God to renew us yet one more time. To give us strength. To give us hope.

Will Spring Ever Arrive? By Karen Gieseke Director of Family Ministry Southeastern Minnesota Synod

Be patient, then, brothers and sisters, until the Lord's coming. See how the farmer waits for the land to yield its valuable crop, patiently waiting for the autumn and spring rains. - James 5:7



While we all know spring will arrive each year, this past Winter challenged us to wonder as we continued to don heavy winter coats, and prepare for yet another day of winter road conditions, waiting not just for the plows to do their job but waiting for a new season to arrive which would free us from the current conditions.

Waiting...Every season in life offers moments where we wait and wonder. We often wish we could shorten the waiting and just move on to what's next. But what happens in the midst of the waiting if we are willing to allow that time to be something more than just "waiting"?

Well-known pastor, priest, professor and author Henri Nouwen wrote about waiting through a lens of invitation and transformation. He writes, "Waiting is a period of learning. The longer we wait, the more we hear about him for whom we are waiting."

As I continue to walk alongside congregations and families throughout the synod, I hear many stories of "waiting." Some are daily life reflected through comments like "I can hardly wait for the new baby to arrive!" or "Wait until you see the new carpeting! You will love it!" to broader congregational comments like "How long do we have to wait for a new pastor to arrive?" to "We can hardly wait for new families to join us!"

But what might happen if we listened to both the words in James 5:7 and Nouwen's invitation, and made waiting a time of learning. And in this learning we learn more and more about God, and what God is up to in both daily family life, and the life of our congregations.

As Christians we just journeyed through the season of Lent, which is a time filled with waiting for the Easter story and the promise it brings. But Easter wouldn't be the story of hope that it is if we hadn't waited. We learn so much about Jesus as we listen to his words and watch his actions as he cares for God's people in their daily lives: the lonely who long for a friend; the hungry who need food; those in the margins who deserve to be loved; and the vulnerable who need support. We learn about God while we wait. And the longer the wait, the more opportunity to hear God's story in and through those we encounter.

I am glad spring has arrived and I no longer have to wait. But thanks to Nouwen's words, I am entering into new seasons and moments with a new sense of possibility when I do have to wait...whether it's waiting in the grocery store line or waiting to see responses to bigger questions about God's activity in the world. So how might waiting become a positive, enriching experience in your faith and your relationship with God? Can you imagine yourself embracing "waiting" because it invites you to learn about God, deepen your understanding of being in God's family, and living as Jesus' hands and feet in the world? Do you want to learn more about God? There's no need to wait! God's Peace in your midst.
